Emergency Ride Home

Free Emergency Ride Home Now Available for Carpoolers, Bus Riders, Walkers and Bicyclists in the Tri-County

What keeps you from carpooling or biking or taking the bus? For many, its being prepared for an emergency and being able to get to those in need or being prepared to stay late to meet a deadline. And for many its the cost for the emergency trip.

With the national average price for a gallon of regular gasoline already at \$3.90 and summer just around the corner, Charleston area employers are looking for ways to encourage employees to use the bus, bicycle or carpool to work. But Berkeley-Charleston-Dorchester Council of Governments' Mobility Manager Vonie Gilreath notes that "one of the biggest obstacles to getting students and employees to use the bus or carpool is the cost of getting home in case of an emergency".

Solution: The Berkeley-Charleston-Dorchester Council of GOvernment's onlin Trident Rideshare program now offers Emergency Ride Home reimbursement to employees and students who use alternative modes of carpooling, bus, vanpooling, bicycling or walking in the BCD counties at least once a week and are registered with Trident Rideshare. Whether you face a family illness or are asked to work unscheduled overtime, the program ensures that you will get reimbursed if you have to go home via taxi or bus with minimal extra expense to you and your employer.



Audubon Lecture: Birding in Cuba May 9

Ms. Cornelia Carrier, longtime board member and past President of the Charleston Natural History Society, will present a program on her birding trip to Cuba in 2011. The largest island in the Caribbean, Cuba has a wide variety of habitats, and around 370 species of birds have been reported there (with 28 endemic species). The highlights of the talk will be the birds she observed, of course, but Cornelia will also describe her experiences with transportation and life in Cuba.
